Humanities

We will do this daily in the class in the morning and we will build up to writing our own weather reports.

Skills and knowledge: to identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the equator and the North and South Pole.

We will be learning about significant historical events, people and places in Bath. We will be focusing on Harbutt who was the inventor of plasticine. We will be using Harbutt to inspire our art and DT this terr

Skills and knowledge: to describe significant people from the past and significant historical events, people and place their own locality.

We will be using Musical Minis along with BBC Ten Pieces Dance. are also involved in the Trees of Hope project in Zimbabwe.
