Communication and Language Development

- Begin to explore blending and segmenting familiar sounds to form words.
- Explore and recognise the different ways that print can be used and create our own posters to promote the importance. of Earth Day.
- Continue to explore stories and their structures and write our own using texts such as "Whatever, Next!" for inspiration.


Expressive Arts And Design
