Spring Term 2025 Year 3 — Our Response to our City



<u>Writing:</u> We will be using our focus texts as stimuli to retell scenes from a story using dialogue. Writing diary entries, letters, non-chronological reports, newspaper reports, setting descriptions and narratives.

<u>Skills and Knowledge:</u> Organise paragraphs by theme; using and punctuating direct speech; using conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause.

Reading: We will be reading a variety of texts that relate to our topic.

<u>Skills and Knowledge:</u> Preparing scenes to read aloud and perform, increase familiarity with a wide range of rich texts, including myths and historical fiction. Predicting what might happen from details stated and implied.

Humanities

<u>History:</u> We will be analysing The Roman Empire and its impact on Britain with particular reference to water, heating and architecture. We will also visit the Roman Baths to immerse ourselves in the History of our unique World Heritage City and develop our appreciation and understanding of it.

Knowledge and Skills: Know and understand significant aspects of the Roman Era, including the expansion and dissolution of the empire; key figures, events and achieve ments; cultural similarities and differences to the modern day and it's impact on Britain and on our own City of Bath.


<u>Geography:</u> Volcanoes and Minerals—Focus study on <u>Mount Vesuvius</u> and it's impact on Roman Pompeii.

<u>Knowledge and Skills:</u> Describe and understand key aspects of physical geography including mountains and volcanoes.


French: Les Animaux (Animals), Les Fruits (The Fruits)

This term we will be responding to the following question: 'Why do we live here in Bath?'

We will be diving into the History of the Roman Empire, discovering how the Romans lived, why they conquered Britain and why they settled in Bath. In Science, we will investigate plants, rocks and minerals looking for more answers as to why and how the Roman Baths and our city is so unique.

Our core texts for this term will be: 'Roman Diary: The Journal of Iliona, a young slave' by Richard Platt, Empire's End: A Roman Story by Leila Rasheed and 'The Pebble in My Pocket' by Meredith Hooper and 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit.

STEAM

<u>Science</u>: We will be researching Plants and Rocks. We will conduct experiments investigating how water is transported in plants and what the requirements for life are.

Knowledge and Skills: Identify and describe the functions of different parts of plants; compare and group together different kinds of rocks based on their appearance and simple physical properties.

Art Develop mastery of art techniques, including painting, printing and 3D sculpture. Focus Artist: Lubna Chowdhary, Focus Work: Metropolis

Inspired by our exploration of The Romas and Romans in Bath, we will make clay models and relief prints of Minerva's Owl and construct a Roman Shield. Connecting with our exploration of Pompei we will make a clay model of a Volcano and watch it erupt!

Knowledge and Skills: Develop, model and communicate ideas through cross-sectional diagrams, 3D models, prototypes and cross-sections.

Computing: Creating media: Stop-frame animation.

We'll be using a range of techniques to create a stop-frame animation using tablets. Then we'll apply our skills to create a story-based animation linked to our work on The Romans. And finally we'll learn how to apply additional features to our animations, such as music and text.

Christianity:

Creation/Fall—What do Christians learn in the creation story?

Salvation—Why do Christians call the day Jesus died 'Good Friday'?

Knowledge and Skills: Make simple links between the Gospel texts and how Christians mark the Easter events in their church communities. Describe how Christians show their beliefs about Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday in worship.

Maths

We will follow our Power Maths scheme to cover multiplication and division. We will also learn about money, statistics and

length before moving onto learning about fractions. We will practise our timetables daily, using TT Rock Stars.



Knowledge and Skills: Multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. Add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts. Interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables. Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm). Count up and down in tenths; recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts.

Health and Well-Being


PE: Basketball, Dance and Football. And, we'll be starting a new 'personal best challenge'!


Knowledge and Skills: Perform dances using a range of movement patterns; take part in indoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team, develop and apply understanding of when and why we pass, dribble and shoot in order to score points.

<u>Mindfulness:</u> We will share daily mindful moments including Relax Kids sessions, Sensory Circuits and other mindfulness activities to enable us to relax, connect with our bodies, the world around us and understand ourselves better.
